

Unfortunately, her vision has deteriorated significantly and so she will now be taking early retirement. Mrs Holmes has had a massive impact on the whole school community, not just the children she directly works with. Her work on the Queen's Jubilee Garden, along with the fundraising efforts including marmalade sandwiches and plant pot designing will go down in Ripponden History! Her voluntary before school clubs — Penny for Them and Card Trading have been hugely popular and are incredibly missed. Jo is an absolute ray of sunshine, with an extraordinary skillset, ready smile and infectious laugh, one that we all really miss around the school.

As Mrs Holmes' life has had to significantly change, she is now on the list to get her own Guide Dog. Due to the whole-school impact Jo has had on the school, we thought it only fitting that we raise money in her name for this very worthy cause. We have a lady from the Guide Dogs for the Blind Association coming into school on Monday 26th February to talk to the children in assembly about the work of Guide Dogs and the costs associated with them.

Then, on Friday 1st March, we will be having a whole-school dress down day and bake sale in aid of Guide Dogs. The aim of this day is to raise as much as we possibly can, to donate in Mrs Holmes' name – so please, please, dig deep and support both this very worthwhile cause and the work that Mrs Holmes has done in school. We are then inviting Mrs Holmes back into school to assembly in the afternoon, so she can say goodbye to the children and so we can let her know how much she means to us. Maples Linking Programme

For many years, we have been part of The Linking Network, promoting identity, diversity, community and equality. This year, 25,000 children are taking part from 25 local authorities.

Maples are linked with Falcons Class at Savile Park Primary. We have made kindness leaves to swap with them, showing what we value and want to take local action on.

A national survey has shown that people from all areas value the same qualities: kindness, compassion, honesty, social justice, equality and forgiveness. As well as getting to know other children, the Linking Network allows our children to get to know themselves a little better, too.

Week


