
Dear parents/carers,

#### **Kitchen Update**

Thank you for your patience with regards to the kitchen. I know it is not ideal having cold food and certainly not what we want to be serving.

As you know, we had emergency remedial work done, following a routine service. This was gas works and cost £5,500 to put right. This had to be done to ensure the safety of the school and is now safe and able to run again. However, we have discovered that the ventilation in the kitchen is not fit for purpose and as such must be fixed before the gas safety board will issue a compliance certificate. This has been booked in, although we don't have a date yet for installation. We are hoping for early next week and moving back to hot food shortly after. The cost for this is £7,500.

It will not come as a surprise that school budgets are very tight, and this has come to a great blow to us. In addition to this work that has had to be done in the kitchen, in order to make it safe, our ovens are on their last legs – to the point where suppliers are struggling to get parts for repair. These need replacing. When we replace the ovens, we have to replace the canopies above too, to comply with legislation. While we are waiting for final quotes for this next phase of work, we are probably looking at around **£10,000**.

These are sums which school just does not have. Local Authority maintained schools receive a small amount every year to maintain the whole building, but that does not go far enough to do usual maintenance, let alone a big project such as this. We believe that school food is essential to the community, family feel of our lovely school that we work so hard to achieve. Many other local schools bring food in from elsewhere due to spiralling costs, but we are desperate to hold on to our cooking kitchen, as the quality and quantity of food we offer would not be mirrored if we were to bring food in from elsewhere.

The governors and I will be working really hard to write bids to try and secure funds from local charitable organisations to try to meet the costs. If any parents/carers have any super ideas that we may not have thought of, we would be really grateful – please email the office or catch me on the playground.

I hope to bring you up to date news on when the kitchen will be cooking again and once again, I thank you for your patience and understanding about the work so far.
